

#### **SPARLING:**



# exciting fun art projects




### **ECOLE SIFTON:**

The weather was very welcoming for many outside activities during October. Your children really enjoyed drawing with the chalk, blowing bubbles on windy days, group games such as hide-and-go-seek, and showing everyone how well they can cross the monkey bars. On October 12th, we had our first special guest speakers from the Fire Department. Captain Jeff Knopf (Fire & Life Safety Educator), and Junior Volunteer Kier Boos. Jeff Knopf talked about cooking safety, having an escape plan, he let the children try on the firefighter gear, and brought the firetruck for the children to sit in. Kier Boos played a game of hose bowling and also taught the children how to roll up the hoses.

A lot of children have continued to step up by demonstrating leadership with helping cleanup and showing compassion to their peers. For inside activities, your children enjoyed using their creativity in various crafts, such as perler beads, loom bands, and building a domino effect using the Jenga blocks. We had a Harry Potter Day, which went so well that the children wanted it to continue the following day. ## Fun Things for the Family to Do Together

#### Baked Oatmeal Cups 3 Ways (mamaknowsglutenfree.com)

Baked oatmeal cups are a super easy, make ahead and freezable healthy breakfast. A tasty and healthy grab and go breakfast to start your day.

#### Ingredients


- 2 cups oatmeal (I like Bob's Red Mill gluten-free quick oats)
- 2 large bananas (mashed)
- 2 eggs (whisked)
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 3/3 cup milk (dairy or non-dairy)
- ¼ cup of honey
- 1 tablespoon of pure vanilla extract
- 1 cup of mini chocolate chips (fresh or dried blueberries or chopped apples)

#### **Instructions**

- Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- Spray muffin tins with gluten-free cooking spray or use muffin liners.
- In a large bowl mash the bananas, then add whisked eggs, pure vanilla extract and honey and stir to combine. Add gluten-free oatmeal, salt and cinnamon and stir to combine. Add milk and fully combine.
- Add either ½ cup of mini chocolate chips, blueberries or apples to the batter and stir to combine. For the chopped apples: sprinkle chopped apples with cinnamon and stir to coat before adding to the batter. You can also add a teaspoon of lemon juice to the apples and cinnamon mixture as well.
- Scoop batter into muffin tins and top with remaining ½ cup of mini cholate chips, blueberries or apples.
- Bake for 20 minutes. Enjoy!

#### Fingerprint Poppy Art (craftymorning.com)

- You will need red/black/green/yellow paint, white paper, and 2 paintbrushes.
- Start by having your kids dip their thumbs into red paint and making a circle shape with their prints. Doing 4–5 thumbprints per poppy looks best!
- After the red paint has dried some, have them dip their pointer finger in black paint and dab the middle of each flower.
- Take a small paintbrush and put a dot of yellow paint in the middle of each flower. Then have them paint skinny green stems. The last step is to take a bigger paintbrush and have them make a ton of "X's" at the bottom to make grass! That's it!

#### **Schedule Changes for Your Calendars**

It is important that we know which children to expect at OSCAR in order to ensure their safety and prevent missing children situations. Please remember that if notice of cancellation is not received by the OSCAR Director by noon on the day before, there shall be a minimum one-hour charge per day or day rate as per family contract. If no notice is given and a child does not arrive at the program as scheduled, a \$25 no-show fee shall be charged.

All schedule changes MUST be made by contacting the OSCAR Director by email, with advance notice to **info@camroseoscar.ca** or calling the OSCAR office at CDFCSS 780-672-0141. If there is no answer, please leave a detailed voicemail in regards to what you are calling about.

When sending an email, or leaving a voicemail, please include the following information:



- Childs full name
- Program location
- Reason for absence (if your child is ill I need to know as it is a licensing requirement)
- Date absent
- Time of the call

If your child is schedule to attend OSCAR and has joined an after school activity, it is VERY IMPORTANT that you notify the OSCAR Director/Office of the late arrival to the program after the sport activity. Scheduled children need to check in with the OSCAR staff before going to the activity. Once they check in, they go directly to the activity so they are not late.

#### Helpful tip

- Email your child's teacher to let them know when your child has OSCAR.
- Write in your child's agenda they go to OSCAR
